

Communications Volunteer Videographer



Summary:

AMOS offers a **2-month to 1-year** videography internship for people interested in public health reporting, with a commitment to highlighting existing health inequalities for rural populations. The main responsibility of the Videographer Intern is to connect the work of AMOS to an outside audience through multimedia.

Expected Duration of Applied Position:

- 2 months to 1 year

Language Required:

- Spanish Level 5-3 (Professional Working Proficiency) or higher

Duties and Responsibilities will include the following:

- Work with AMOS Primary Health Care team staff and Communications staff to create storyboards for each video related to an AMOS program or project. Examples of programs or projects are: the Primary Health Care Program, Youth Empowerment Project, Clean Water Program, Dental Project, Solar Panel Project, Mother-to-Mother/Community Doula Project, Patient Care Program, Reading Glasses Project
- Record video footage in rural communities of the work being done on AMOS programs or projects
- Organize and back up all footage recorded in the rural communities
- Edit footage and create a promotional video for each or some of the AMOS program or project

- Promotes the vision, mission and strategic goals of AMOS
- Displays cultural, gender, religion, and age sensitivity
- Strong interpersonal, teamwork and communication skills
- Capacity to plan, prioritize and deliver tasks on time
- Capacity to engage with national and international staff
- Sensitive listener and interviewer
- Enthusiastic about the mission of AMOS

Technical Competencies:

- Advanced videography skills
- Advanced video editing skills
- Experience in nonprofit communications

Education:

- Applicants with BS or BA preferred.

Language:

- S-3 Professional working proficiency or higher. A person at S-3 level is described as follows:
 - Able to speak the language with sufficient structural accuracy and vocabulary to participate effectively in most conversations on practical, social, and professional topics
 - Can discuss particular interests and special fields of competence with reasonable ease
 - Has comprehension which is quite complete for a normal rate of speech
 - Has a general vocabulary which is broad enough that he or she rarely has to grope for a word

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- Has an accent which may be obviously foreign; has a good control of grammar; and whose errors virtually never interfere with understanding and rarely disturb the native speaker

Working Conditions:

- At AMOS headquarters: 48- hour week (Monday – Friday , 7:00am – 4:30pm)
- In the field: At pace of the supervision/delegation team (Usually 7:00am – 6:00pm)

Program Costs:

- Volunteer Program and Activities Fee: \$2,000. This fee includes airport pick-up and drop-off, work materials, grounds transportation related to the program, as well as all administrative support services.
- NOTE: Participants are responsible for housing and meal costs during their time as a volunteer. AMOS can refer participants to its guesthouse services and host family options.
